CONSIDER THIS

The National Day of Prayer is an annual observance held on the first Thursday of May, inviting people of all faiths to pray for the nation and its leaders. While it feels like a long-standing tradition, its modern legal form is actually a mid-20th-century development.

The practice of national prayer dates back to the very beginning of the United States:

1775: The First Continental Congress issued a proclamation for a day of prayer, asking the colonies to seek wisdom as they formed a new nation.

1863: During the Civil War, Abraham Lincoln famously called for a national day of "humiliation, fasting, and prayer."

1789-1952: Over the years, various presidents issued one-time proclamations for days of prayer, typically during times of war or national crisis.

The observance was formally codified into law through two major pieces of legislation:

1952: Encouraged by evangelist Billy Graham, President Harry S. Truman signed a joint resolution (Public Law 82-324) declaring an annual National Day of Prayer. At that time, the President could choose any date.

1988: President Ronald Reagan signed an amendment (Public Law 100-307) that permanently set the observance as the first Thursday in May.

Today, the day is marked by several key traditions:

Presidential Proclamation: By law, the President must issue a proclamation each year encouraging Americans to turn to God in prayer and meditation.

Community Events: Thousands of local gatherings take place at state capitols, county courthouses, city halls, and churches.

While the National Day of Prayer Task Force (a private organization) often promotes a specific biblical theme each year, the legal observance is intended to be a time for all Americans to pray according to their own faith and conscience. It's a significant moment for many to reflect on the nation's direction, much like movements designed to encourage the population to actively participate on election days, or maintain contact with government officials on a

regular basis.

The recognition that we are a constitutional republic whose elected officials are accountable to the electorate, should cause us to remember the God of our fathers, to Whom we are accountable for the direction of our national affairs.
