CONSIDER THIS

Celebrated annually on June 14, Flag Day commemorates the adoption of the Stars and Stripes as the official flag of the United States. It serves as a day to

honor the national symbol, reflecting on the country's history, ideals, and the shared values of freedom and unity that the flag represents.

How Flag Day Originated

1. The Resolution of 1777

The foundation for the holiday was laid during the American Revolutionary War. On June 14, 1777, the Second Continental Congress passed a resolution establishing a unified flag for the new nation:

"Resolved, That the flag of the thirteen United States be thirteen stripes, alternate red and white: that the union be thirteen stars, white in a blue field, representing a new constellation."

2. The Father of Flag Day

For decades, the anniversary of this resolution passed with little public notice. The push for an official celebration began in the late 19th century, largely credited to a 19-year-old schoolteacher named Bernard J. Cigrand.

In 1885, Cigrand placed a small, 10-inch 38-star flag in a bottle on his desk at a one-room schoolhouse in Fredonia, Wisconsin, and assigned his students to write essays about the flag. From that point forward, Cigrand dedicated his life to writing articles, giving speeches, and petitioning the government to establish a national day of reverence for the flag.

3. Becoming an Official Holiday

Cigrand's efforts, along with those of other patriotic organizations, gradually gained momentum:

1916: President Woodrow Wilson issued a presidential proclamation establishing June 14 as Flag Day. However, it was not yet a permanent national statutory holiday.

1949: President Harry S. Truman signed an Act of Congress that officially designated June 14 of each year as National Flag Day permanently.

National Flag Week

Today, Flag Day is part of a broader National Flag Week. During this week, the President issues a proclamation urging U.S. citizens to fly the American flag from their homes and businesses. It is a time to remember the journey of the nation and to display the banner that has stood as a symbol of endurance and hope for nearly two and a half centuries.

This year, National Flag Week leads us into the celebration of the 250th Birthday of the Nation. While we do not ask God to condone or endorse much of what our Nation stands for, we do ask that our God would make right the many wrongs which plague us. We ask that He would bless us with a revival of immense proportions as we reach the end of this age. We also acknowledge the past reception of abundant blessing for His hand, which has given us the freedoms and liberties we enjoy.
